



2013 HIGHLIGHTS

Dear Stakeholders,

As our 36th year of existence comes to a close, we feel genuine satisfaction in the role we have played in improving the quality of life in the communities we serve and are excited for what the future will bring.

The development of sustainable neighborhoods of choice results in not only the visual benefits of an improved physical appearance for the neighborhood, but also in the intangible benefits; the pride of knowing that lives are forever changed and community spirit is lifted, that tear or smile exchanged when a family realizes the opportunity to buy their first home, or the undeniably positive influence of the



YouthWorks program on a young man or woman as they learn new skills that will benefit them throughout their lives. And, there is no denying the sense of accomplishment community members feel as they graduate from the Westside Leadership Institute and are empowered to enhance their lives and the community as a whole.

The impacts of our contributions are deeper and stronger than ever, and it is with great pride that we share our accomplishments of 2013;

- Homeownership Services program funded 1st and 2nd mortgages for an investment of \$2 Million and facilitated 45 1st mortgages statewide for an additional investment of \$7 Million;
- Community Based Economic Development activities focused on strengthening program infrastructures by securing \$125,000 for an Economic Development Specialist position over three years and \$110,000 for North Temple Business Façade grant program;
- Community Building and Organizing engaged over 20,000 residents and hosted 125 special events to highlight Salt Lake City's west side and Murray City neighborhoods. Westside Leadership Institutes graduated 46 individuals who used their skills to take on community challenges.
- YouthWorks[™] secured over \$100,000 of new funding allowing it to expand services to serve more youth.
- Real Estate Development acquired seven problem properties in the neighborhood; one particular property that blighted the neighborhood for over 25 years.
- Affordable Housing Mission Investment (AHMI) raised \$10 Million to grow this national fund to \$25,000,000 to help build communities across the country.
- Murray Branch office invested \$183,000 in renovating blighted properties.
- Resource Development raised \$400,000 in private support and \$940,000 in public grants, including five new funding sources.

Each layer of brick and mortar, slab of concrete, and finishing touch are the physical manifestations of what drives us; the belief that helping others to improve their lives is of vital social, economic and ethical importance.

We continue to grow as an organization; deep roots are being established within the communities we serve as evidenced by the revitalization effort along the North Temple corridor and the Murray community's first home purchase. This would not be possible without the strong collaborative partnership of private business, government entities, donors, residents and a strong NeighborWorks organization kept in motion by a dedicated staff that gives tirelessly, a board of directors, committee assignees and volunteers whose souls become invested by volunteering their time to the organization.

We are grateful for the many investors, volunteers and stakeholders who continue to support NeighborWorks Salt Lake. We look forward to engaging you in our 2014 challenges and opportunities to build community.... Neighbor by Neighbor... House by House... Block by Block...

HOMEOWNERSHIP SERVICES

- Funded 10 first mortgages for a total investment of \$1.6 Million
- Funded nine second mortgages for a total investment of \$277,072
